The improvements range from a very large 4 bedroom brick homestead in excellent condition featuring a spacious living area which is heated by a combustion heater for the winter months and air conditioning for the summer months.

There is a covered breeze way through to a double garage which has a shower and 2nd toilet plus separate laundry and office.

Other improvements include a 3 bay machinery shed, dairy building and stockyards.

To me the quality of country will definitely sell this property with its rich alluvial creek flats and long frontage to Warrazambil Creek, to its gentle rolling fertile hills and valleys that have been pasture improved with Sateria and legumes such as Wynn Cassia then running back into some timbered areas.

The property is subdivided up into over 20 paddocks and is ideal for cell grazing with most paddocks having trough water which comes from an equipped bore, there are also 3 dams on the property.
