Improvements include a one bedroom shed, which the present owners of 20 years have used and enjoyed mainly as a weekender. They also run a small herd of cattle to keep the grass down and have recently put many km's of 4 wheel drive tracks around the property. If you don't want to run your own cattle then one of the neighbour's would be interested in agisting the land

Back Creek has many native animals including Platypus, perch and a few crayfish which have been seen and caught in the stream. "Boorabee" means Koala and with the various species of hardwood and gums there are bound to be many of the furry fellas there. Two other dams are located around the property for the livestock and a poly water storage tank for the shed.

This volcanic basalt soil property is gentle undulating at the front and runs
