Footings: Concrete & Brick

**Uprights:** Brick & Timber

Floor: Reinforced concrete basement, saw timber to the balance

External Walls: Brick

**Internal Walls**: Brick & Fibrous Cement

Windows: Timber casements and aluminium to front facade

**Lighting:** Fluorescent tube lighting throughout

**Ceilings:** Pressed Metal and Fibrous Cement

Floor Coverings: Painted Timber & Carpet

**Roof:** Corrugated galvanised Iron & Zincalume
